ANDERSON MAKES GOOD

Chas. Anderson, formerly of this place, but now of Wendell, Idaho, on the Twin Falls tract is making quite a success of farming. The following is what The Hub City Irrigation of Wendell, has to say of his efforts:

"Chas. Anderson brought in last Thursday the tallest wheat and oats with heads to match that it has been our pleasure to see this year. The oats were six feet tall with abnormally long heads. The oat leaves were an inch wide and the straws were larger than those used at soda fountains. The wheat was of the Blue stem variety. It was five feet tall and stood out splendidly. The heads are five inches long and well filled with plump kernels.

Mr. and Mrs. Anderson have developed their farm until it is said by those who have seen it to be the best large acreage of crops around Wendell, the grain covering seventy acre.

We have the sample brought in on exhibition at this office and it is attracting a great deal of attention."

Major Fred R. Reed writing to the Hub City Irrigationist, of Wendell, Idaho, on the irrigation subject has the following to say of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Anderson, who recently moved from La Grande to a farm near Wendell on the north side tract:

"Within three miles of my office in Wendell is a seventy acre tract of land that up to the first of April was covered with sage brush just like you see for miles and miles in southern Idaho. I will take any one out to that seventy acres now and show with a great deal of pleasure what Charlie Anderson and his wife have accomplished. They have seventy acres of wheat and oats from five to six feet high, wheat heads five inches long and oat heads a foot long. I can show you where one single grain of wheat has produced 50 heads of fine grain."
