Resolution creating improvement district No. 4 in the City of La Grande, Oregon, and declaring the intention of improving the same.

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, that Washington avenue be, and the same is hereby declared to be, and designated as improvement district No. 4 in the City of La Grande.

Be it further resolved, that it is the intention of the Common Council, and is hereby so declared, to improve that portion of said Washington avenue on and along the west half of lot 5 in block 1 in Grandy's addition to the town of La Grande, by constructing a cement sidewalk five feet wide along the north side of said above described property.

Be it further resolved, that the Council appoint three commissioners from among its members to make an examination of said property, as to the valuation and extent, if any, of the benefits to be derived by said property by reason of said improvements.

Be it further resolved, that this resolution be published in one issue of the papers of the city.
