New Rates Effective.
The new freight rates, ordered by the state commission because of the complaint by the Enterprise Commercial club, were put into effect last Thursday, August 5, and mean a reduction on all incoming freight from Portland or elsewhere in Oregon of from 10 to 18 per cent, according to classes and towns. The reduction to Joseph and Enterprise is much larger than to Wallowa, because more of local rate was knocked off, but there is a substantial reduction to Wallowa.—Enterprise News Record.
