MEREDITH BOY HURT

Gifford Meredith, son of Rev. B. F. Meredith, who a few years ago was pastor at the M. E. church here, but at present is at Vale, was seriously burned near Atlantic City some few days ago by the explosion of a gasoline yacht. Gifford and his grandfather were riding with the mate of the boat, neither paying any attention to the boat's progress. Suddenly an explosion rent the air, throwing the mate out of the boat, and collapsing the roof of the cabin on Gifford. With splendid presence of mind the mate returned to the boat and removed the boy before the burns were fatal. The aged man was less exposed to immediate danger. Immediately after a complete rescue was effected, the boat was rent into by a second explosion. Mrs. Meredith, who was out of New York City at the time, heard of it by meagre wire reports, and was of course, in mortal agony until she learned the exact extent of the burns. According to advices received by Mr. Meredith at Vale, his son is badly burned about the head and face, but apparently is under no immediate danger of fatal outcome.

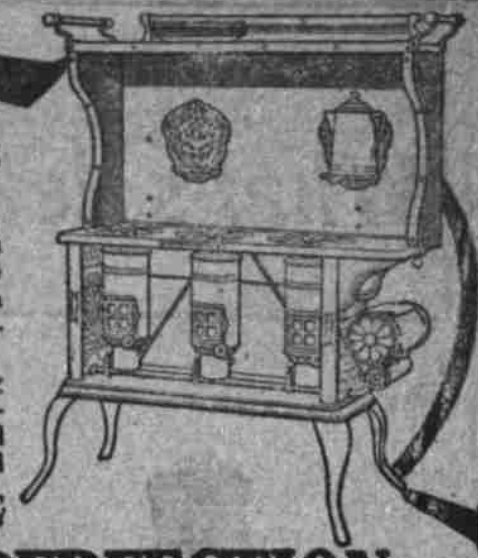
