M'CLELLAN IS GREAT ARTIST



One of the big features of the program at the tabernacle tonight will be the playing of Prof. J. J. McClellan, organist. He is one of the most noted men in the musical world, and has played at all the world's fairs in the past 10 years. As organist of the tabernacle choir he played more than a thousand organ recitals, having had as guests the nobility of many foreign countries, cabinet officers and other notables.

Mr. McClellan is composer of the famous irrigation ode which was

awarded the first prize in the competition before the congress. The ode is now the official musical feature of that congress, and is rendered by a large chorus at each session. The last rendition was by a chorus of 251 voices at the Spokane congress recently. C. P. Ferrin of this city sang the tenor role on the occasion of the first rendition at Ogden, five years ago. Mr. McClellan will play one organ solo and will also accompany the choir and soloists tonight.
