Some grain is being sold at present, the farmers are holding however, the sentiment general just prior to harvest that \$1.00 wheat would prevail is being abandoned.

Forest fires have destroyed more timber this year than at any period since the government has protected the timber reservations. So far Oregon has been fortunate.

The county court of Tillamook county have purchased a rock crusher and roller and as a result many miles of modern roads will be built during the next few years.

Rogue River fruit growers have a large crop of peaches, pears, grapes and apples this year, for which they expect to realize \$1,000,000. The fruit acreage of southern Oregon is increasing year after year.

Portland Baptists fear Dr. Brougher of White Temple, may accept a call from Los Angeles, which the vacancy caused by the resignation of Dr. Burdette, who is suffering from a fall from which he may never recover.

From now on every grower of asters will be taking special care of the most perfect ones. September 10th is quite near and upon this occasion the most beautiful flowers grown in Union county will be on exhibit. Aster Show Day in La Grande is a recognized annual event looked forward to with anticipation and delight by all.

The manager of the Pendleton fair has let a contract to increase their stock stacks. Those who entertain the idea that the farmer will not exhibit their fine stuff under canvas should visit the Pendleton fair. It will not be necessary however, they will have their doubts relieved by visiting the Union county exposition at La Grande, the first week in October.

It is claimed that between 12,000 and 14,000 tourists daily pass through Portland. A still greater number naturally visit Seattle and of which is truly gratifying to the residents of the northwest. Seeing is believing, and no one can pass through this great common wealth without becoming impressed with the future possibilities when our resources are developed and homes are to be found on all our fertile lands.

If the remarks made by J. L. Dumas, President of the Washington Fruit Growers' association, are true, there is certainly a great future for the apple. He states that the prices are too high. "That it is better to sell 100 apples at 5 cents each, than 10 apples at 10 cents each."

"We growers can take less for our apples and still sell at a profit," he said. "The railroads cantake half what they are now getting and still haul at a profit, while the commission men can take a fourth and still make money."

All of which would mean doubly the consumption of apples. If this is true it will be done in time.

Thousands of bushels of Umatilla county wheat will be hauled to the Cold Springs landing on the Columbia river, this season. This is the direct result of the visit to this city Saturday of Rodney B. Smith, the representative of the Open River Transportation company, says the

Much wheat immediately tributary to Cold Springs has been hauled to that point in the past. This has been due to the fact that owing to water competition the railroad company has been forced to make a rate to Portland a cent and a half lower than from any other point in the county that does not have water competition. Now, however, Mr. Smith announces that the Open River company is in a position to transport the wheat to Portland for a cent and a half per bushel less than the railroad, making a total difference in favor of the Cold Springs shipper of three cents per bushel or nearly seven cents per sack.
