NEWARK, N. J., Aug. 24.—Before the state water supply commission, in the Newark city hall, a public hearing was held today on Newark's application to acquire and develop the Wanauque river watershed as a source of additional water supply for the city.

It is asserted that fifty years from now the people of Newark "will be going around with their tongues hanging out, begging for water," if some conservation plan is not adopted in time to prevent a contingency.

The city of Paterson had representatives at the hearing, who strenuously objected to the plan.
