**SURVEY STARTED ON THE
NORTHSIDE PROJECT TOO**

Faces uplifted and turned toward the Sandridge country, where water is needed perhaps even more seriously than on the south side. Engineer Darley and his crew yesterday commenced running surveys for the main canals that in the near future to carry water to points north of the river. Rain today stopped the work, but the first step has been taken with that object in view.

Now that it is learned that over 25000 acres can be watered on the south side, and the voluminous data and field notes have been converted into maps, the irrigationists are turn-

ing toward the Sandridge. At this time the north side work is experimental, the engineer not being decided as to the place of the intake or the probable direction of the main canal that will overlook the Sandridge. It is such details as these that the survey started yesterday, is intended to settle.

After the engineer has skirmished about picking directions and locations, he will then be able to run the permanent survey and give out the facts to the anxious land owners toward the north who are waiting for knowledge on these matters.

BEET FIELDS**

Beet fields on the La Grande side of the valley have been aided greatly by the slow but soaking rain which fell last night and this morning. During the past two weeks the fields near La Grande have shown signs of needing water, more so than outlying districts and the rain filled a want. While the total precipitation was light it was of such a nature that fields will profit greatly by it. Fall plowing was tedious before the rain and though somewhat relieved would be abetted even more with additional rainfall.

Threshing throughout the valley was given a setback which is not regretted, for threshermen and crews have taken advantage of the opportunity to come to La Grande for bodily rest and repairs for machinery.

Mr. Lewis will be ready to order the shipment sent forward as soon as he secures places to unload the shipment when it comes.

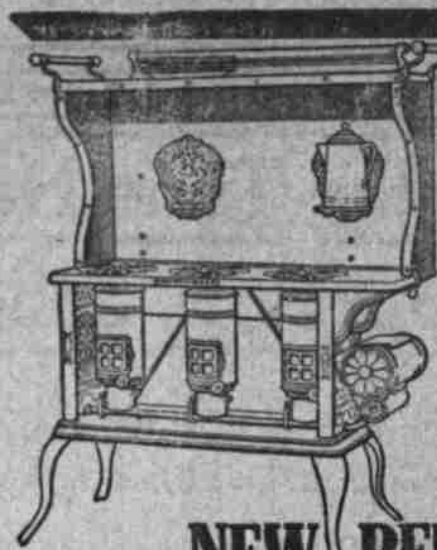
