INCREASE IN RECEIPTS

Another indication of the rapid growth and enrichment of the city of La Grande is reflected in the monthly report of Local Agent Hibbert of the Pacific Express company for the month of August. The increase in business over the same month last year is \$641.50, an amount that should warrant at least better facilities for the public here. The express business is always a month-piece of the business activity for when there is no business there is no express.

A few years ago this sum would be a fair month's business in itself, but now approximately \$600 is only the increase in business over past months. With little or no apple shipments by express during the last month, the business is purely national and not swayed by seasonal commodities.
