Next May the one hundredth anniversary of the first savings bank in the world will be celebrated. It may be news to not a few to learn that the idea originated largely with the clergy of England, who realized that many of their membership needed a place to keep their weekly earnings. The first modern savings bank, the one for whose hundredth anniversary preparations are now being made was originated by Henry Duncan, a Presbyterian minister of Scotland. The idea grew and extended to other countries rapidly, as such institutions in all communities small and great have grown to become powerful and helpful factors in the upbuilding of industry and thrift.
