## CLOUDBURST DOES DAMAGE

BAKER CITY, Sept. 7.—Sunday morning considerable damage was done by a cloud burst to Cornucopia and surrounding country. Several houses situated on the hilly section of Cornucopia were struck by lightning and washed into the canyon.

The principal street of the city was made clean of wagons, buggies and farm implements in less than fifteen minutes by the torrents of water washing down the high mountains overlooking the mining town.

It is reported that a lone miner was caught in the storm and his whereabouts have since been unknown. His horse was found dead however, and it is believed that he suffered death by lightning.

Bridges between Cornucopia and Carson, a small village five miles distant, were all washed out and drift wood piled, in many places, fifty feet high.

Charles Zimmerman, a farmer near Carson, was driving from Cornucopia when the storm arose and had considerable trouble in staying in front of the downpour. One bridge went out just after crossing.

## BUYS NORTH POWDER FARM

VICTOR BEAN WILL CONDUCT A  
900 ACRE RANCH THERE.

Will Live Here But Devote Time to  
Stock Raising on New Ranch.

Victor Bean the wood man, has purchased a 900 acre ranch, two miles from North Powder, known as the Coughenour farm, and while he will not live there, he will do the ranching himself. About 700 acres are good farm land, and with 200 acres for pasture land he hopes to be able to raise considerable stock.

Mr. Bean went to North Powder by train today, and his sons will take teams and farm implements over the hill by the wagon road.
