BAKER SEEMS CONFIDENT.

Big Baker City Gladiators Are Train-
ing.

BAKER CITY, Sept. 15.—A few of
the old timers on the football team
turned out for practice last evening
and as soon as a coach can be se-
cured regular training will be estab-
lished and the boys will get down to
hard work to prepare for the com-
ing games.

Prospects for winning the cham-
pionship of Oregon were never bright-
er than they are this year, for not
more than two of last year's fast team
will be missing, and perhaps only
one. Jack Jett, who played end, is
going down to Eugene this year and
a man will have to be chosen to fill
his place. It is a question as to
whether Parm Hunstock will be here
this year, for he is now in Salt Lake
and may remain there and go to
school. He is a heavy man and was
always to be relied upon at tackle.
With nine old men in the game and
plenty of good material to choose
from, the boys should round into a
faster and steadier team than last
year. Roy Denham is captain this
year and will probably play quarter.
He is one of the fastest men in the
game and is conceded to have an ex-
cellent knowledge of the fine points
of the game.

An important factor is the selection
of a coach, and it is understood an
effort will be made to secure the ser-
vices of Judge James H. Nicola, who
is responsible for turning out the
fastest teams that have ever played
in Oregon. Under his coaching, Baker
high won the championship of
the state for two consecutive years,
and were defeated but once in three
years. He has the faculty for develop-
ing the team work to a high degree
and gets the best results out of ev-
ery player.

The schedule this year will include
five and maybe six games. The first
game will be with Cove on the local
field, then the boys will go to Ontario
for a game and returning will play
La Grande here. The game with Pen-
delton will be played in Pendleton on
Nov. 13, while the Thanksgiving date
is still open. The local team may go
to Astoria for that date and if they
do, an effort will be made to secure a
post-season game for this city with
the champions of the valley.

To Abolish Dives.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—With the
aim of wiping out the few remaining
dives and disreputable drinking places
in the city, the applications for a re-
newal of license filed by the 15,000 sal-
oonkeepers of New York will be sub-
jected to a most rigid examination.
The period for filing applications and
bonds expires today, and between now
and October 1, when present certifi-
cates expire, the records of all the li-
quor dealers will be thoroughly ex-
amined.
