Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating improvement District No. 2, and designating Third street, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 1st day of September, 1909, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Third street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by building a 5-foot board sidewalk thereon, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All the west side of Third street, from the north side of "C" avenue, to the south side of "K" avenue. That a certain deed of conveyance between David B. May and Mary E. May, his wife, as grantors and Bert M. Benton, as grantee, be made to conform to the true agreement between said parties; that defendants be decreed to be the successors in interest of the said David B. May and Mary E. May, his wife, and as such required to make, execute, and deliver to plaintiff a good and sufficient conveyance of the following real estate, to-wit: the east half of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section 10, township 3 south, range 40 east, Willamette Meridian in Union County, Oregon; said conveyance to have the effect to convey any and all right, title and interest of defendants and each of them in and to said premises to the plaintiff, and further requiring said deed of conveyance to be made, executed and delivered within a reasonable time, to be fixed by the Court; and in default thereof the decree of this court to stand as and for and have the legal effect of a deed of conveyance to be entitled to record as such and such further and general relief as in equity may be proper.
