Oregon has contributed eight millions to the reclamation funds of the general government and gets back but three. The expenditure of the missing five millions in Oregon would create fifty in land values.

There is no doubt that the assessment of real estate in Portland are away below the figures for which it is selling. One piece of property sold a few days ago for half a million and was assessed for \$77,350. Another that was offered for a quarter of a million to the city is listed at less than \$84,000 by the assessor. There are probably hundreds of such instances. It would not take many to equal the entire assessed value of any one of several counties in Oregon.

Stanfield is the new irrigation town in Umatilla county. Over a mile of concrete sidewalk has been laid, merchants are doing business in tents waiting the completion of concrete buildings, over 100 men are employed in the town proper and about 75 on the storage reservoir dam. Laborers are reported as being scarce at \$2.50 a day. Water, capital and labor have increased land values around Stanfield from \$2.50 an acre to \$250.

LARDERS OVERFILLED

BUILDING TWO WAREHOUSES TO HELP STORE CROPS

New Warehouse at Imbler up, And New One at Union to be Built—Island City Farmers' Warehouse Can't Use Overflow—Five Mills All Running One Shift Daily But Can't Make Room For Incoming Wheat—Gain Report Soon.

Wheat larders of Union county are overflowing. Notwithstanding that the Co-operative Farmers' Union has just completed a large warehouse at Island City, where at least 30,000 sacks of wheat will be held for sale, the chain of five flouring mills from Elgin to Union is unable to cope with conditions without increasing capacity room. Another warehouse is to be built at once.

The unprecedented crop this year has already filled the mill elevators. All of the five mills in the county are running one full shift a day, but the amount of flour ground does not make room for the wheat coming in as small sales or for storage purposes. The big problem which the owners of these various mills have to cope with, is what to resort to without building new buildings. At Imbler this has been found the only solution, and a large and commodious addition has been completed already. It is filling up rapidly.

No sooner was the Imbler addition completed than a 70-foot addition to the warehouse at Union, was found necessary, and steps are now being taken to rush construction there, as the constant flow of sold and storage wheat is driving the mill men to speedy action.

The wheat harvest and threshing is now rapidly nearing the point where it will be possible to gain accurate estimates of the yield for the county.
