BIG PURSE FOR A MULE

Fat sums of money are in store for the man who brings the prize-winning yearling mule to the county fair. In addition to the pool money and the fair premiums, there is a prize stake of \$125 posted now, all of which will be pulled down by the prize yearling. As stated in the Observer a few days ago, a pool exists with three already having anteed with \$10 each. This three-cornered pool is open to Union county and of course there will be more to enter for the stakes later on. The winner, to be named by competent and impartial judges, will thus take all the pool money which at present is \$30, but may grow to unlimited size, the \$7.50 premium money offered by the fair people, and in addition \$125 which were posted last night by J. D. McKennon. Two hundred dollars are the number of simoleons which the winner will undoubtedly pull down. There is a great deal of interest taken already.

SURPRISE SPRUNG ON COACH.

Big Little Player Shows up at Help La Grande Win Honors.

A surprise in the way of an unlooked for "Big Husky" was sprung on Coach Wall and the local high school football squad at practice yesterday afternoon when "Big" Little a product of the La Grande grades appeared on the field. Little weighs 175 pounds and measures almost six feet in height. At present he is the heaviest man on the field.

The new man, whom the players have nicknamed "Big," a suitable title to fit his real name "Little," has been attending the White school and the north side school during the past three years. He is inexperienced but has the weight and action to make a crackerjack lineman. Coach Wall tells him that a new broom is supposed to sweep clean.
