AWAIT STEEL FOR BRIDGE

Reinforced concrete abutments for the new county bridge over the Grande Ronde river at Oro Dell, were completed Saturday, and contractors Campbell and Fitzgerald, have but little to do from now until the steel arrives. The scaffolding, with exception of one bent, has been erected and as soon as the connecting link is put in, there will be nothing but awaiting steel which is due to come October 1st.

With the completion of the abutments, an idea of the stability which the new bridge is to have, can be gained.
