FARMERS WILL MEET WITH IRRIGATION DIRECTORS

Farmers living near the path of the main south artery of the water system which is to irrigate the Grande Ronde valley, have on grounds which they individually deem sufficient, put a temporary halt to the progress of building the ditches. At a meeting of the directors last evening it was arranged that these farmers should meet with the committee next Friday evening, when all places which are not fixing now will be rectified. It was

the intention of the directors to issue advertising for bids to construct the south ditches, last, evening, but inability to get all necessary rights of way, by reason of objections raised by the land owners in some instances, forced them to postpone this important step. It is not thought that the temporary halt will be material in length, for differences will no doubt be settled Friday night.

It is alleged who were in the building.

When a committee who has the tabernacle in charge heard of what was reported they visited the building but could find no evidence whatever of any fire, not even the burned paper.—Baker City Herald.

Fighting New Rates East.

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—The Merchants' association of New York today presented to the Interstate Commerce Commission resolutions declaring the application of northern roads to the commission for a readjustment of rates from all eastern points on practically all commodities to Spokane an acute discrimination against eastern manufacturers and jobbers in favor of those of the Middle West. The outlook is for a strong fight on both sides of the subject. The application in question was the outgrowth of the decision given in the Spokane rate case.


