It has been framed up by local parties that the requests made by the company will in a large measure furnish the key to its plans.

That the road is to cross the Blue mountains by Elgin seems certain. The course to be followed from there is not so certain. One report has it that the road is to follow up the Grande Ronde river and by that route reach Harney county. If this line goes La Grande will be on the natural main line.

This plan is supposed to be in the minds of the men behind the enterprise and also the plan to build another road from Elgin to Idaho and thence to reach Butte, Montana. It is thought that the amount of land

LICENSE ON NEAR BEER LEGAL

beverages, except beer, ale or porter, etc."

The complaint in this case charging the defendant with selling and disposing of "near beer." If the complaint had charged the defendant with selling and disposing of "other malt beverages" naming the article so alleged to have been sold and disposed, then it might have been necessary to have negated the exception by showing that such article so disposed of was not "beer, ale or porter."

"Exceptions and provisos in a criminal statute need not be negated in an indictment unless they be descriptive of the offense, or a necessary ingredient in its definition. State vs. Tamlar, 19th. Oregon 528 (9 L. R. A. 853 25th Pac. 71)."

The exception beer, ale and porter, as we view it is in no wise descriptive of the offense of selling Nearbeer without a license, and it is not a necessary ingredient in the definition of the offense.

For the above reasons we believe that the motion to dismiss the case should be denied and it is so ordered.
