SOLID BEDROCK FOUND AROUND MEADOWBROOK

Bringing the most optimistic reports from the "promised land" at the mouth of Meadowbrook, Harry Stoner and his crew is home from Meadowbrook, where a most exhaustive and careful study of bedrock in the region of the dam site was made. They have been gone about a month and the search for flaws in the bedrock was unsuccessful. Splendid rock formation bottom exists under the monster dam to be built there. The bedrock is not "provincial" as it were, but runs out a great distance each way, so that the construction of the gigantic cement dam will be done on a most solid foundation.

This fact is just what the directors have been waiting for, as the engineers could not make a recommendation as to the exact building place until the strata under the surface had been studied. Mr. Stoner brings one of the most pleasing bits of news of several months in connection with the construction of this irrigation project.

Attired for a Climb and Juncket trip Through the Yosemite Valley

El Portal, Cal. Oct. 7.—Dressed in a suit of knockabout clothes, capped and heavily shod, President Taft accompanied by Governor Gillett and other prominent men of the state of California, started on the first excursion to the Yosemite valley today. Six and eight horse stages carried the party into the valley and every appearance of the party is that of an ordinary party staging to the valley for pleasure and a hunting trip.

There is now only one telephone line connecting the president with civilization, but this line is said to be carefully guarded to insure that no tampering with the wire may occur while the president is in the valley. The hotel at El-Portal during the night was completely surrounded by U. S. regulars under the charge of the officers from the post, and the president passed an undisturbed night arising this morning with his usual well known smile.
