## CIVIL SUIT ON TODAY

Following the decision of Judge Knowles yesterday afternoon in which he declared the city ordinance of prohibition, passed under the 1908 charter, null and void and dismissed the city's cases against Ralph Atkinson, a lull in Atkinson's troubles has come and will last until Saturday, when he will make his plea to the charges brought against him by the grand jury.

A jury was secured in less than 15 minutes, Attorney B. F. Wilson for the plaintiff asking no questions and no challenges being made by either side. Attorney L. J. Davis is representing Hall.

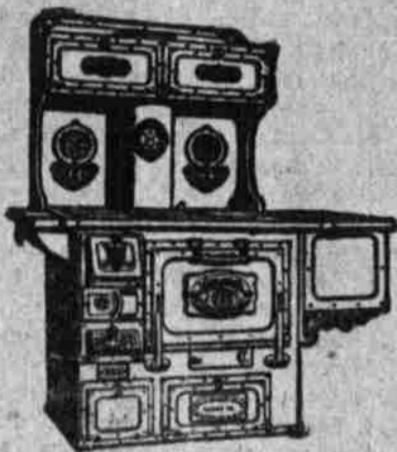
