BENEFITS TO RESULT

RATE HEARING AT SPOKANE WILL BRING RESULTS.

La Grande Only City Represented by Attorney from Eastern Oregon

That material gains are assured to result from the recent hearing of the rate cases at Spokane, is the opinion of Attorney Turner Jones who returned yesterday. La Grande was the only town on the O. R. & N. line represented. Pendleton had filed a complaint but had no attorney there and Baker City flunked out altogether.

The railroad companies offered to Spokane and the commission certain reductions, the amount of which runs something as follows: \$1.73 for \$2.04; \$1.07 for \$1.73; \$1.89 for \$2.20; \$1.42 for \$2.05. These reductions, however were offered by the western roads and apply to shipments from Chicago.

rate zone established in the territory, 100 miles around Spokane so as to keep out competition, but the commission announced that this was a test for the consumers and not to benefit the jobbers.

Another abuse that the railroads promised of their own accord to rectify, is the custom of allowing mixed car loads to La Grande or other inland points on the same basis as unmixed. For instance it has been the custom that if La Grande wanted to ship in farm implements, she must order a complete car load of headers, a complete car load of binders or a complete car load of plows. Portland, however can get rates on cars containing some of each of these kinds of implements. This is now to be allowed all inland cities.

Special attention was called by attorney Oliver to the rates on cement. He said that this commodity especially concerned La Grande at this time as the street paving work was about to be commenced and an irrigation project was now under way and that sidewalks were being built at a rapid rate. He pointed out to the commission that Ogden cement was

shipped as far east as Omaha and sold for one-half of what La Grande has to pay for the freight.

MARS BUYS CRUSHER

John L. Mars who has the contract for macadamizing Adams avenue, today purchased a rock crusher from a Portland firm and it will be shipped at once. The machine is a duplicate of the one owned by the county and it will come completely equipped with every necessary attachment. It is not entirely new but has been overhauled thoroughly and will have the same capacity as the one now owned by the county.

Mr. Mars is making preparation to commence the work as soon as possible and already is gathering the extensive outfits needed to do the work.
