## NEW TIME IS OUT

Commencing tomorrow there will be more trains running west than east on the mainline of the Harriman system from Green River through La Grande to Portland. Tonight at midnight the new schedule providing for one fast mail train goes into effect. No. 11 now running as a local train arriving in the morning, has been chosen to carry the west mail from Green River to Portland and while provisions have been made for a fast mail westbound, no such arrangements exist for eastbound mail, according to the official time table which is just out. No. 10 arriving here at 10:40 a. m., will carry in addition to its regular passenger loads the mail cars which No. 11 takes west. In this way the accumulation of the mail cars in Portland is avoided. Remarkable fast time is outlined for the fast mail train. It will arrive in La Grande at 10:50 p. m. and will leave immediately. It will reach Portland at 7:50 the next morning. This will beat the fastest time ever scheduled on the O. R. & N.

Train No. 12, the twin of the present No. 11, has been annulled. Trains No. 1 and 2 are new ones, but they only run between Portland and Pendleton. The schedule as it goes into effect tomorrow, follows, officially.

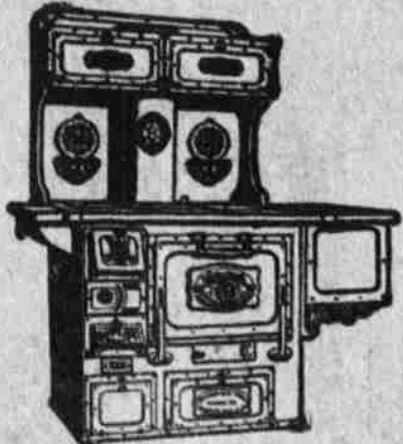
