## CHARITY ON PASSENGER

NINETY DOLLARS AND A PASS IS GIVEN NEEDY WOMAN.

Passengers on Train Last Night Show True Western Kindness.

A remarkable example of spontaneous charity occurred on the Atlantic express, between Pendleton and La Grande last night. A destitute woman with three children, all under five years of age, was the beneficiary of an outburst of benevolence which netted her the handsome sum of \$90.25.

At Pendleton, the woman, with a babe in her arms and two little girls tugging at her skirts, boarded the train and when the conductor came along gathering the tickets, the woman dug up an armful of small change, saying that it was all the money that she had and asked the conductor how far that sum would carry her.

"If I should overlook your oldest child which is a half fare, this money would carry you, madame, over the mountains to La Grande. This conversation and the fact that the children were hungrily eating a lunch of dry bread caused the near by passengers to gather about the woman and to ask questions.

The woman gave the name of Mrs. E. Smith and said that she was working her way to Grand Junction, Colorado, to join her mother; explained her shortage of funds by telling a pathetic story of the violent death of her husband who was recently killed by having an outlaw horse fall on him, which occurred some five weeks ago on a frontier ranch in Alberta.

Upon hearing the details of her pitiful story, Wilbur F. Brock, a newspaper man of Portland, started a movement in the car to get help for the woman. Press Lewis of this city came to his assistance and with Mrs. Henry Davis of Joseph formed a committee to go through the car and solicit aid to the fund necessary to carry the woman and her children to their home in Colorado.

Among those who gave liberally toward the \$90.60 purse were Dr. Walter the famous Seattle wrestler and Division Superintendent A. Buckley of this city. In the standard sleepers the committee was ably assisted by Mrs. S. M. Pennock and daughter, two prominent eastern ladies enroute to Denver.
