Trainmaster Buckley is at Gibbon today making arrangements for the new system which at present is planned to take effect next Monday.

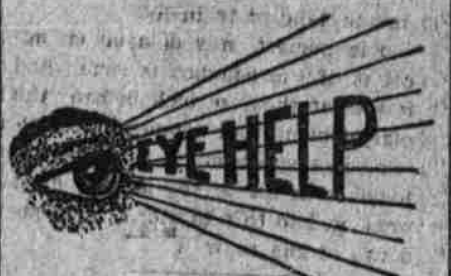
