## FORENSIC CONTEST ON

TEN LOCAL DEBATORS WILL SEEK  
HONOR OF TEAM.

Campaign for State Debate Period Commenced in La Grande.

Prospective La Grande high school debaters are vigorously exercising their mental muscles on the question: "Resolved, that surrounding circumstances have a greater influence on character than natural ability." This question is to be used in the local try out which will be pulled off in about two weeks. At this time two teams will be selected for the state campaign this year.

Nothing has been heard from the state committee on debating and the question for the opening of the series has not been reached. La Grande, however, is not going to lose any time in getting her representatives picked out and started to work. Under the grilling course of practice planned for the local debaters by Superintendent J. D. Stout, the local high school stands a splendid running chance for the state championship.

About ten students have entered for the try out. It is expected that by the time this preliminary contest has been pulled off the state question will have arrived and the teams will put to work.
