In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled court and action on or before the expiration of the time prescribed in the order directing the publication hereof, to-wit: six consecutive weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons which is October 15, 1909, and if you fail to appear, answer or otherwise plead within the said time, the plaintiff will take judgment against you in the sum of \$76.20 with interest thereon from the 1st day of January, 1909
