Y. M. C. A. IS THE TOPIC

REPRESENTATIVES FROM THREE STATES TALK HERE.

Y. M. C. A. Building is An Asset to Any Live Community.

Declaring that one of the assets of any modern up-to-date city, is a well equipped Y. M. C. A. building, where the young men and boys of the city may find a place of amusement and recreation and wholesome environments, a series of addresses of high character were delivered in this city yesterday by Ivan B. Rhodes, secretary for Oregon and Idaho, H. E. Stone, general secretary of the Portland association, and Robert Carey, secretary of the association in Walla Walla.

In the morning the men spoke in the Presbyterian, Baptist, Methodist and Christian churches. In the afternoon Secretary Rhodes talked to the men at the Pastime theatre, and in the evening Mr. Stone, assisted by Mr. Rhodes delivered a lantern slide lecture in the Christian church. The impressive point in this lecture was that all the cities in the country that are alive and booming are getting in these fine buildings in which the men may keep their bodies in condition under the eyes of a trained physical director.

While every Oregonian felt proud of the magnificent Portland structure, costing over half a million dollars which Secretary Stone cordially invited the La Grande people to visit when they came to Portland the lecturers set a number of thoughtful men of this city to thinking of the time when La Grande shall catch the spirit now moving such cities as Payette, Eugene and many others that are no richer than La Grande to erect these "body and character plants" and to reap the rewards of advertising and citizenship upbuilding from them.

START APPLE PICKING

GROWERS HOLDING OUT FOR A LARGER PRICE.

Buyers Not Willing To Pay That and Sales are Few Thus Far.

Apple picking throughout the valley started in full blast today. Pickers are apparently numerous and the packers will be put to work at once. As Monday opened with a beautiful array of sunshine, it is also apparent that excellent weather will favor the harvest of the golden apple.

As harvest is now on, it will soon be possible to ascertain definitely the size of the crop. County Fruit Inspector Oldenberg and local buyers in general are now convinced that the crop will be better than at first estimated, though, like all other apple centers of the Northwest, it is not up to its usual standard.

Demand Big Prices.
Growers are demanding big prices, even at this time and bulk sales from the trees have as yet, been few, for buyers are refusing to pay the \$1.25 and \$1.50 asked per box. It can be safely stated that apple deals will not be numerous or large until the Eastern markets limber up that buyers may find sales, or else the prices drop to a point where the buyers can see a profit in shipping east. However, it seems positive that the prices will be better than last year by a considerable margin.

Money Order Reform.
Washington, Oct. 18.—Men connected with the money order department of the large post offices of the country are here today in conference with Arthur M. Travers, chairman of the special committee appointed by the Postmaster-general to investigate the money order system and to recommend such changes in its management as will reduce its expenses without the loss of efficiency.
