## FINE TIME AT CALDWELL

### TEAM AND MANAGEMENT SINCE PRAISES FOR COLLEGE TOWN.

#### Heidenrich Throws Pigskin Forty-Five Yards Perfectly.

Conquerors over the College of Idaho football team, an aggregation of players that runs up huge scores on Boise, Nampa, Payette and other high schools and who last year was the undisputed champions of all the south half of Idaho and conceded the championships of the state, and this year winning handily from every team, the La Grande team returned home late last night and today its members are singing songs of praise for the Caldwell aggregation. "Treatment accorded us by the management, the faculty and the student body and players," said Coach Wall, in voicing the sentiments of the players today, "could not be surpassed. The players played hard but clean. The reception after the game was full of good feeling, and all around, the La Grande team has never found better treatment meted out to it in its history."

There were several features in the game, but one draw back existed, and that was La Grande's inability to handle punts well. Caldwell's fullback averaged 50 yards and most of them were fumbled by La Grande players.

On the second down in the game, Vergil Bolton received a perfect forward pass and ran 35 yards, almost a touchdown. Irwin made several pretty passes but Heidenrich out-classed all by making a perfect 45-yard pass to Myers. La Grande's line outplayed Caldwell's line. Out of six attempts La Grande marked four successful forward passes.

An enjoyable trip to Boise climaxed the trip.

Tonight the team commences its training for Spokane high school which comes here next Saturday.
