THIRD PARTY IS FORMED

PENDLETON HOPES TO HAVE A SOLUTION.

"Third Party" Will Attempt to Handle Local Option Matters.

Pendleton, Oct. 12.—The East Oregonian said last night:

The "third party" is launched. Its object is to take the liquor fight out of the hands of the liquor men and prohibitionists as well and to see if a system cannot be devised under which law and order can be maintained, the moral welfare of the city protected and the city given some revenue from the liquor business that is being carried on.

In the hopes of bringing about such a condition of affairs an ordinance and a charter amendment will be devised under the initiative and submitted to the people at the coming city election. These measures will provide for the close regulation of the liquor business in the event the business is legalized again by the votes of the people of the county.

At the mass meeting held Saturday evening it was decided by motion that the chairman, Mayor Murphy, name a committee of five to draft such an ordinance and such a charter amendment and provide for placing the measure before the people at the coming election. This afternoon Mayor Murphy designated his committee.

Meeting Well Attended.

The mass meeting was well attended the circuit court room being well filled. Had the meeting been held on any other evening of the week, the attendance would have doubtless been much greater for the reason that many of the business houses were closed and the store people could not attend.

HOBSON NOT GUILTY MAN

JURY RETURNS A VERDICT AT 2 O'CLOCK A. M.

Defendant Thanks Every Jurymen In a Very Jubilant Manner.

After deliberating until the wee small hours of the morning the jury in the case of the State vs. Guy Hobson acquitted the young man at 1:30 this morning. Judge Knowles and Attorney Slater arose to the occasion and went to the court house, received the verdict, and discharged the twelve jurors that they might get sufficient rest to be on hands again today if called.

Hobson may well be called the happiest man in town. When the charming words "not guilty" were read by the court, he jumped up and made the complete rounds of the jury, shaking hands and thanking each one.
