E. S. NORRIS HOME FROM SEAT. TLE VISIT.

Will Have Long Report of Make to The Union Temorrow.

E. S. Norris has returned from an extended business visit to Seattle and Portland where he made a study of the market conditions. He will make a report to the members of the farmers Union at the regular meeting of that organization tomorrow afternoon.

In speaking of conditions in the coast cities Mr. Norris said this morn ing that while there had been some fall in the wheat quotations during the past two days the outlook is encouraging .He said that the tone of the market was strong owing to exten sive shipments from Portland both by rail and by ship Mr. Norris says that while he looks for no phenominal advances in the price of wheat, he has no tears for the farmers in having more on hands than they can dispose of at a good figure.

In regard to the amount of grain be ing held by the farmers of the Grande Ronde valley. Mr. Norris says there is about 3-4 of the crop left. He says the market conditions are healthy and expresses no doubt but that a good price will be obtained.


