## SHOW LIKED BY AUDIENCE

STAGE SETTING GOOD AND THE CROWD IS HAPPY.

Actors Well up in Their Parts and Play Story is Good.

Few of the large audience present last night at the Steward opera house to witness the presentation of "Corianton" will dissent from the opinion that in part of the scenery and rich customs nothing has surpassed it. In the point of acting, many thought it fully equal to the productions of Chas. B. Hanford. The audience was not familiar with the play which in a measure took away many of the fine points brought out by the veteran artists.

Al. G. Swenson in his delineation of the character of "Corianton," whose recent presentation of the principal roles in "The Wolf" was all that could be desired. In the scene showing his temptation while a guest of the evil Seantum and his fury upon discovering how he had been trapped by the wily and beautiful Zoan Ze Isabel, greatly impressed the audience of his ability but not until the death of his brother, did he rise to his climax.

The character of Zoan Ze Isabel is in the hands of Blanch Kendall and received faithful attention. In the scene wherein she beguiles the prophet, Miss Kendall does a fine piece of acting. Miss Ida Due, gave a delightful impersonation of the character of Rella. Frank Jonasson is strong as Shilbon. Luke Cosgrave, the armor bearer and jester gets much out of his role, and George G. Stanley, the blasphemous, in his defiance before the high priest is especially fine.

The ballet is well carried out and the special scenery and the stage setting all add to the spectacular effect.

Fortunately for those who failed to see this great drama another and unexpected opportunity will be given tonight as contrary to expectations, the splendid company will give La Grande two nights. This was brought about late yesterday afternoon. Tonight the opera house should be crowded for the play is far above the expectations of all who attended last night.

## GOODBROD CROP SOLD

GETS \$125 FOR HIS APPLES CASH DOWN.

Other Crops Bring Equally Profitable Prices to Him.

General A. J. Goodbrod, of Union, who possibly has the most intensely cultivated fifteen acre farm in Union county, was in La Grande yesterday, and when met by an Observer representative in response to the question "How are you General?", replied: "When a man is prosperous he is generally happy. I have done exceedingly well this season; yesterday I sold my apple crop for \$125 per box and got the money. Last year I not only sold for less money but did not get cash. My prune crop brought me \$36 per ton and my pears \$25 per ton. There is big money in fruit in the Grande Ronde valley at these prices."
