## TWO CASES REVERSED

### O'SULLIVAN WINS HIS CASE IN HIGHER COURT.

### Barnes Case Also Reversed in Decision by Supreme Court.

Attorneys Cochran & Cochran received word from Salem yesterday that the Barnes case had been reversed.

It will be remembered that J. R. Barnes of Ritzville, Washington, brought a habeas corpus proceeding in the Union county courts to recover the possession of his child which had been committed by the court to the custody of its maternal grandmother, Mrs. Cora Long.

The decision of the supreme court that the father has the right to the possession of his child under all circumstances until he had committed some act or been proven of an evil moral character.

### O'Sullivan Case Reversed.

News was received also, of the reversal of the O'Sullivan case. This was a Wallowa county case O'Sullivan was preparing to move to Union county and was selling his property at auction when the sheriff seized it for taxes and held and sold it for the taxes.

The trial was brought to Union county and held before Judge Wm. Smith. Wallowa county won the suit. O'Sullivan appealed to the supreme court and that court held that Wallowa county sheriff did not prove a sufficient title to the property to sell it.

### GREAT AUTO RACE MEET.

San Francisco, Oct. 22.—California will make a bid for the world's automobile racing honors tomorrow, when one of the biggest events of its kind ever pulled off in this country is scheduled to take place in Oakland. The race is to be for stock cars and is over a course in Alameda county, which is a drive of 20 miles in length. The entire distance of the race for big cars will be 300 miles and will be for the Portola prize, valued at \$5,000. A race for light cars will also be held at the same time for a prize of \$1,000. Both of these events will be held at the same time and the cars of both races will be classified according to cylinder displacement.

The cars entering the big event will have to have 300 and one inches and over cylinder displacement, while the competitors in the light carriages will have 300 inches and less displacement. The roads over which this race are to be held are the finest in California, there being 10 miles straight away on one-half of the course and very few turns in the other half. Speed drivers who have already gone over the course are unanimous in their opinions that recordbreaking speed can be made over its entire length.

### BUILDING COMPLETED.
