LA FOLLETE SWAYS HIS AUDIENCE NEARLY 3 HOURS

A burning message of the dangers of monopolies to true representative government was brought to the people of La Grande last evening by Senator Robert M. La Follette, who spoke with rapidity and passion for almost three hours in the Mormon Tabernacle. The speaker was introduced by the Rev. Ford Ellis at 8:15 and until he was forced to bid his audience a hasty "Good-night" at 10:45 the people were held in rapt attention.

The central theme of the lecture was that unless the representatives of the people obey to the letter the will of the people who send them to congress the people have entirely lost control of the government. He said the government was founded in patriotism and wisdom but that conditions arisen from which the fathers of the republic never dreamed. This was the monopolistic condition of our present industrial life. Competition, demand, supply—the natural basis of economic growth, he said had been thwarted by combinations that had built up unnatural tariff walls, created fictitious prices and corrupted law makers.

La Follette attacked the recent tariff and stated that not a rate in it was sufficiently low to be true to the party's pledge. He showed with tremendous force how the senate is ruled by one or two men. He said that its organization at the opening of congress occupied about 40 seconds of time. With cut and dried process one man moved that Senator Hale act as chairman and that he appoint a chairman of the committee on committees with power to chose his associates. This office falls to Senator Aldrich and with the caucus adjourned with the legislation of the next two

years determined.

A feature of La Follette's lecture was a picture of the growth of centralization of the wealth of the nation. He said that with the assistance of a company of experts and the expenditure of much money he had tabulated the directors of the big companies of the United States and had found that 97 men controlled all the directorates.

Of this number only fourteen had enough money with which to justify their positions. The remaining sixty were simply tools. A representative tool he said was Chauncy De Pew. He declared that this number was being boiled down until two men, Rockefeller and Morgan, were soon to control the entire country.

La Follette also showed that there was no business reason for a panic in 1907 but that with relentless cruelty the greatest tyrants that the world has ever seen, Rockefeller and Morgan, forced the panic for petty, selfish, political reasons. He told with great force of the freezing out of a number of big companies by those two interests.

The senator closed with his earnest appeal: "Give us senators who will do their duty in working against this great evil that is threatening the liberties of the people." A railway commission, postal savings banks, and a scholarly and able tariff commission is other things for which La Follette is pleading and working.

The next lecture in the series will be on November 15, when Le Francis Lybarger will speak upon the subject "Land, Labor and Wealth." An effort is to be made to attract a large attendance to this lecture from the farmers and laboring classes.
