## MACHINERY HAS COME

The long talked of macadamizing Adams avenue from Hemlock street to the city limits is soon to be an accomplished fact.

Two car loads of machinery belonging to Contractor John Mars arrived and were unloader this morning. The crusher is being installed today and all arrangements for pushing the work to a rapid completion is being provided for.

The equipment received this morning consists of a crusher, a road roller, wagons, plows, etc. The rock is to be crushed at the place where the improvements are to be made. Contractor Mars says that the rock must be hauled under either arrangement and he prefers to have the crusher under his direct supervision.

About twelve men and nine teams are to be put to work as soon as the crusher is set up and got ready for business. It is to be hoped that the present fine weather will continue so that the work will not be retarded in any way. The macadamizing will connect with the two mile strip recently put down by the county and will when finished, make a long piece of ideal road.
