MANY BOXES OF BOOKS

"Think of it gentlemen, ten cents for each child will soon give them books of inestimable value to their lives," one senator at Salem is reputed to have said in the senate when the law to allow 10 cents per child for public school library books was being debated. The wisdom of the remark is being demonstrated every year in the generous equipment received by the county school superintendent for distribution.

Yesterday, three large boxes were carted to the office of Superintendent E. E. Bragg. The three boxes aggregated about 1,000 pounds of books selected either by the teachers of the districts or by Superintendent Bragg himself, and, are, therefore, the very best for the children of the county.

Many of the small country districts have had but few pupils and have, therefore received but a few books, but it is the testimony of the teachers in these schools that these few books frequently are more useful, in that they are more thoroughly read and digested than many of the books in the larger libraries.
