DAMAGE BY FIRE HEAVY

Fire in Blue Mountain Hotel Retained Department's Good Work.

The actual damage done to the Blue Mountain House and its contents is hard to ascertain. Will Church, the owner, is to day arriving at some logical estimate, but though the building is badly burned within, the furniture is not the only loss, for the furnithre in 20 rooms is soaked and marred. The fire got into a bad location and kept the department active to get at the sat of trouble.

The origin was evidently in an oil-house in the rear of the addition to the hotel. From there it spread to the inside of the main building, breaking out in the roof at frequent intervals. Ready and timely attention by the department prevented a spread to the barns and other wooden structures close by.

JUDGE REVIS IN THE CITY

Judge Revis, a pioneer of Wallowa county, where he is better known as "Uncle Dave Revis," spent yesterday afternoon in the city, going out on the evening train for Hood River where his sons, William and Albert reside and where he makes his winter home. Ten days ago he was called to Enterprise by the sudden death of his brother "Uncle Joe Revis."

Uncle Joe Revis and his noble wife "Aunt Emma," also were pioneers in Wallowa county. They owned fruit land near Enterprise and a number of houses which they rented. When the aged man was stricken he was unable to speak again. He is survived by his wife and his two sons, Frank Revis, cashier of the Wallowa National bank and David Revis, a civil engineer in Texas.

Judge Revis was appointed the first Judge of Wallowa county but resigned in favor of Perter O'Sullivan. Mr. Reavis then accepted the office of the first county clerk of Wallowa county. His title of "Judge" comes from the state of Missouri where he was the head of the county court of Johnson county for many years.
