RAPID WORK ON REPAIRS

After one week's work in the local telephone office W. S. Bell, the special workman sent here to put in the special improvements has the work well started and sees about six week's work ahead of him. An extension to the switch board capable of accommodating the business on 160 new lines and about 300 new 'phones is included in the plans.

Mr. Bell states that La Grande will, when the work is finished, have one of the most up-to-date offices in the state. Especial equipment is being installed to better the toll and farmer lines so that the long distance and out of own offices may be expected to improve. The job represents the expenditure of about \$2,500 on the local office.

"PEDDLER" IN TROUBLE

FIRST REAL CASE UNDER NEW ORDINANCE IS HEARD.

Ruling on the Scope and Width of the New Anti-Peddler License Ordinance Curtailed by the Decision of the Court on Technical Point—Local Representative of Union Tea and Coffee House Arrested—Real Virtue of the Law Untested.

One of the first applications of the anti-peddler's ordinance which recently went into effect, is to come to an issue late this afternoon or tomorrow when Miller, the Union Tea and Coffee Man will be tried on the charge for which he was arraigned a week ago, namely, peddling without a license. At that time he refused to plead one way or the other, admitting the facts in the charge, however. Friends of Miller, declare that he is not a so-called peddler, while it is apparent that the very desirable law that forbids unrestricted peddling also covers the sort of distribution of goods which Mr. Miller works under. Considerable interest centers in this case as it will determine the width and scope of the new ordinance.

Miller canvasses for orders for an outside firm in the residence district and then delivers the goods later. The case came up to issue sooner than was expected and ended the same way. The complaint stated, in copying the wording of the ordinance that the defendant sold to a Chief of Police Raburn by sample and catalogue. The testimony later showed that a verbal price had been read off but that there were no samples. Seizing this as a loophole to end the litigation, Attorney G. T. Cochran moved for a dismissal and the court upheld the ruling.

FILL VACANCY TOMORROW

SUCCESSOR TO MRS. IVANHOE TO BE CHOSEN.

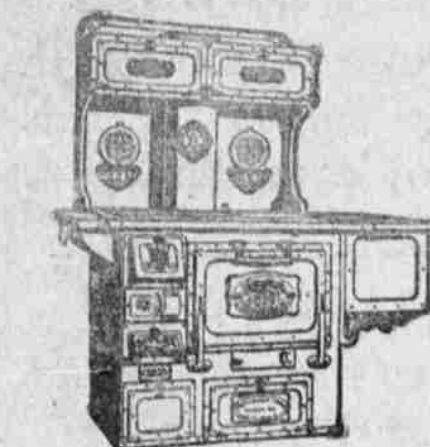
