SELECT A SUCCESSOR TO BOLTON

That the contractors will probably get to the reservoir site with the Beaver creek pipe line early in December and that the city will not be able to have a reservoir much more than started by that time, came out at the meeting last night. The council again hesitated at the estimate of \$9,000 placed upon the work by Engineer Pickler and before starting the work will get other estimates to corroborate these figures which are said to be higher than was expected. On Tuesday the councilmen will accept the invitation of the contractors to go over the line and inspect the work that is being done.

Kammerer is Councilman. At the close of the council meeting the members got an inspiration to vote on a councilman to succeed S. N. Bolton in the first ward. A number of new names were suggested and general favor seemed to rest upon E. W. Kammerer. A ballot was taken but Kammerer got but two votes, the remaining votes being scattered, no man getting more than one. A second ballot gave Kammerer four votes and there was still no election. A third vote broke the record and Kammerer was given a majority vote of the council, all but one vote being cast for him.

The bid of J. L. Slater of \$1,570 for enlarging and improving the city hall was accepted. In this bid Mr. Slater specified the use of stone for foundation purposes instead of cement, owing to the scarcity of cement. This will enable the work to be started at once.
