**Chinese Students Coming.**  
Washington, Nov. 5—Forty-seven Chinese students are due to arrive in San Francisco today and will shortly enter various American universities and colleges. The young men are sent by the Chinese government in compliance with the understanding with the United States regarding the disposition of the indemnity remitted by this government. A number of Chinese officials and educators of prominence were selected as a board which, acting with Dr. Tenney, the Chinese secretary of the American Legation, conducted the examination of more than 500 young men who presented themselves for examination with the view of testing their fitness for this designation. These students were first examined in Chinese and then in English, and those who passed

these first tests were examined in mathematics and elementary science. Only 47 finally passed.

**Schools as Social Centers.**

Pittsburg, Nov. 5—An interesting experiment had its inception today when the Thaddeus Stevens school was opened as a social center. Public meeting, reading and music rooms were thrown open and classes in cooking and physical training were inaugurated. If the plan is successful, it is likely that all of the public schools of the city will be used as social centers outside of school hours.

**Corn Day in Illinois.**

Springfield, Nov. 5—Corn day was generally observed in the schools of Illinois today by exhibitions of the cereal and the reading of papers and

essays on its culture. Young farmers all over the state have exhibited their corn and suitable prizes will be awarded in all of the counties for the best display of ten years each.
