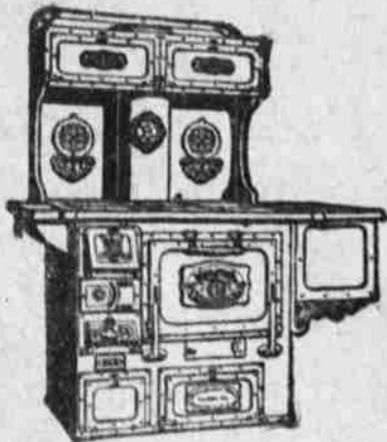

TESTIMONY ON "RIGHTS"

MILL CREEK LITIGATION WILL BE RESUMED.

Many Depositions will be heard Tomorrow Over Water Right.

In taking the deposition of W. T. Martin tomorrow before the county clerk in relation to the rights of some of the claimants to the waters of Mill Creek near Cove and further in relation to the adjudication of the general water rights of that district by the state board of control of the state of Oregon, the hearing of the Mill Creek water cases will begin. The hearing before Commissioner Saxton of the Second district has been set for the 22nd of this month in this city. Saxton's ruling will be final with the circuit court and a decree will be handed down confirming the decision.

The water users along almost every stream in the state have applied for hearings and Commissioner Saxton and members of the board are working them off as rapidly as possible. Catherine creek and Powder river will be the next streams in Union county to be adjudicated as the irrigators along each of these have applied for hearings.
