The direct cause of his death was due to an affection of the heart. He leaves to survive him his wife, two daughters and one son.

Apple Crop is Short.

New York, Nov. 8.—New York commission men today completed their compilation of the apple crop reports and estimate the total for the country at approximately 23,000,000 bushels. This compared with 25,450,000 barrels in 1908. This is the third year of indifferent apple crops, and the totals named fall far short of such seasons as 1906, 1904 and that ever memorable bumper crop, 1906, which is still discussed as a high water mark in the conventions of fruit growers and dealers.
