Alfalfa has taken an upward step recently. A prominent local dealer said this morning that the farmers would not part with baled alfalfa for less than \$13. This means an advance of \$1. In all other lines the market is strong.

The market the line of mill feed is strong. The fact that the Grande Ronde Valley is a milling center has no tendency toward the lowering of the price of mill feed owing to the fact that the market is strong on the outside and this prevents shipping in to lower the prices locally.
