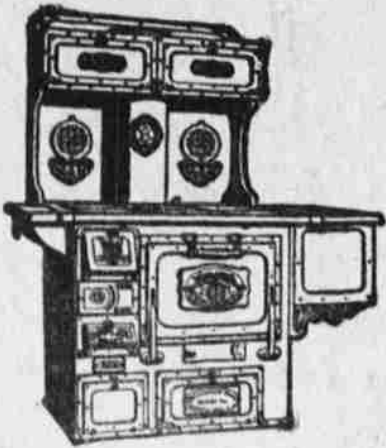

FIRE LAST NIGHT MIGHT HAVE RUN RAMPANT

Firemen Find Rocks in Nozzle Which the Streams

One of the most spectacular and brilliant fires which has visited the city recently broke out last evening at 8 o'clock in a large barn on North Greenwood street owned by Mrs. Rose Harris. The fire department was on the scene in a hurry and soon had the fire under control.

The barn was a total loss, no insurance being carried. A. V. Oliver had about 30 tons of hay in the barn which was either burned or destroyed by the water and smoke. There was some insurance on the hay. No cause for the fire has been discovered.

One of the mysterious events connected with the fire was the discovery of several large rocks in the nozzle of the fire hose. This forced the firemen to stop and remove the nozzle before putting the stream on the blaze. Chief Jones does not take the view that the work was done maliciously but only through the mischief of boys. The nozzle hangs on the hose cart and the rocks could have been dropped into them.

STEAMER'S STRANGE TALE.

Awful Experience of The Maragosa in A Tropical Hurricane.

New Port, News, Va. Nov. 10.—The steamer Mariposa arrived here today almost a total wreck. The captain and passengers tell a strange tale of their awful experience while off the coast of Jamaica last Saturday evening and while they were doing their best to weather the frightful hurricane which swept that island and the surrounding seas.

Captain Jamison says that they were steaming on their usual course when about 8:00 in the evening he detected the approach of a hurricane. He immediately diverged from their usual course in order to get away from the land which was no great distance on their starboard. Within thirty minutes

from the first indication of the approach of the storm and while he was still on the bridge, the storm struck. At first it was not so bad. But in a few minutes it had increased until the huge vessel was almost lifted from the sea. They fought for four hours in the tempest and several times during that period the vessel was turned completely around and huge water spouts broke over the side of the vessel. He says the sea was altogether unlike anything that he has ever experienced before. It seemed that some terrible subterranean forces were at work and the waves ran in mountains and seemed to come from all directions at once. On the morning after the storm while he was still on the bridge and before the break of day he distinctly felt the ship tremble as if she had struck a submerged rock and immediately afterward a strong smell of sulphur filled the atmosphere for miles around. It is his opinion that an earthquake has occurred somewhere.
