GAME WILL BE PLAYED

FINAL EDICT GOES OUT FROM THE WHEAT TOWN YESTERDAY.

Pendleton Management Decides Finally To Play Game Friday.

The football game between Pendleton and La Grande high school team will occur in this city next Friday afternoon, despite the cold weather. This was the announcement that was made this morning by Manager Hawley Bean, who yesterday called the game off. The desire of so many Pendleton people to see the game regardless of whether the weather was cold or hot or dry or wet, lead the manager to reconsider his decision and the game will be played, says the Pendleton E. O.

The Pendleton men are all more than anxious to redeem themselves for the defeat of last Friday and they will profit by their former experience and feel confident of their ability to send La Grande home with the small end of the score.

The team has also been considerably strengthened by the reappearance of Snyder in the game. He is ten pounds heavier than Williamson whom he replaces and this ten pounds is needed in the line.

The line up of the Pendleton team will be: Struve, center; Snyder, left guard; Milne, right guard; Graham, left tackle; Hinderman right tackle; Sturdivant, left end; Jordan, right end; Kimball, quarterback; Bean, left half; Thompson, right half and Devine full-back.

Target Practice at Night.

New London, Conn., Nov. 17—A novel and highly interesting experiment in target practice will be made to-night at Fort Terry, Plum Island, when the 3-inch batteries will fire 38 shots at a moving target illuminated by powerful searchlights. The projectiles will be fitted with the Semple shell tracer so their course can be followed during the entire flight.

This is the first time projectiles have been fired at night in the Department of the East, and several prominent officers of the artillery branch of the service from Governor's Island and Washington are expected to witness the experiment. The 131st company at Fort G. H. Wright, Fisher's island, recently established a record for 3-inch guns, firing 16 rounds in 50 seconds, the last shot demolishing the target, so that the exact number of hits could not be determined.
