APPLE SHOW PRESENTS KNOTTY  
AWARD PROBLEM.

Various Districts Conditions Differ so  
As to Worry the Judges.

Spokane, Nov. 17.—The National Apple Show judges are having considerable difficulty in judging the Washington and Oregon fruit that has been grown in the various districts because the fruit from the higher altitudes and irrigated land is more uniform in size and better packed but will not compare with the rich color of the apples that have been grown in lower altitudes and non irrigated districts. The judging began today. There was a large attendance again today.

The show is not national, altogether few exhibits are here from outside of British Columbia, Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana. Many visitors are of the belief that the Hood River apples which measure eighteen and three-quarters inches in circumference will take the big apple prize.

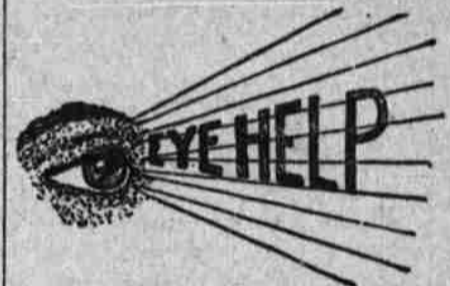
