PEPPERMINT IN OREGON

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE HAS CARRIED ON EXPERIMENTS.

Found that Mint Grows Profitably in This Section of the Country.

Oregon Agricultural College, Nov. 17.—(Special).—In May, 1908, the Michigan experimental station shipped at the request of the chemical department of the Oregon station, a quantity of well bred peppermint roots for a trial on the Oregon beaverdam lands. The roots were planted by Mr. S. C. Inkley of Banks, Washington county, on a typical beaverdam soil, where the plants made an excellent growth during the past season. A quantity of this peppermint has just been tested by us and a yield of 43 of oil found in the green plant. This is a good average yield and taken into consideration with the growth of the plant, indicates that the growth of the peppermint would be successful on the Oregon beaverdam soil.

In practice the plants are cut and while green or partly dried are packed into wooden stills and are subject to live steam. The oil, like all essential oils is carried over with the steam and after passing through cooling pipes collects on the top of the condensed steam. A good average yield is about 35 pounds per acre though as high as 50 to 60 pounds are sometimes obtained.

It is estimated that it costs from 10 to 20 cents per acre to cultivate the mint and from 25 to 35 cents per pound is the price paid for distilling at the central distilling plants which are established in the peppermint districts. The prices realized on the oil varies from 80 cents to \$5.00 with an average price of about \$2.00.

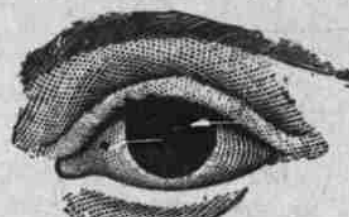

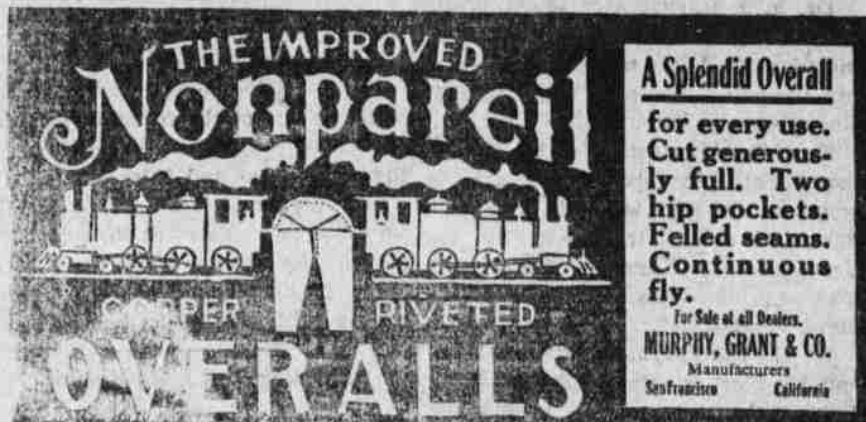
