


Million Mark Not Only Passed but Far **Outdistanced** by Two Banks Of La Grande.

Showing marvelous growth since the last call for statments of the conditions of National banks, the two banking institutions of this city today publishes statements in response to a call issued this morning. Union County, for the total banking busines done in the city on the 16th of this month was \$1,558,117.59, an increase of over \$100,000 since the last statements. For the first time in Union county or the city of La Grande, two local banks show a deposit of \$1,141-338.37.
