## TEAM GOES THIS EVENING

REGULARS KEEP OUT OF LINEUP AND OUTCOME A STUDY.

Those Who Will Go, However are Candidates of Winning a Victory.

Despite the chilly weather and adverse conditions, the La Grande football team with Coach Wall as chaperone will leave tonight for Pendleton where the game with that team will be played tomorrow. For the first time this year La Grande has justifiable grounds to issue hard luck stories. Childers is out. Bean may not be able to get over the fall at center, Williamson is not in good condition, Grandy will doubtless have to stay out and Morris, the new lineman will likely have to stay out, too. This leaves the line and the back field badly depleted with the regulars, but those who comprise the team are tenacious personages and will make great efforts to vanquish the Pendleton team, that the locals may be tied for the championship of Eastern Oregon in fact, as well as on paper, which now is the case, Baker City having defeated Pendleton already.

## CHEAP PLAN IS PROPOSED

NEW SYSTEM OUTLINED IN VERBAL REPORT LAST NIGHT.

Hope to Combine Overflow of Sewerage Water With Irrigation.

In the absence of Mayor Hall, chairman of the committee to look into the proposition of employing a competent engineer to make a sewerage plat of the city as a preparatory step looking to the paving of the business section of the city, Councilman Myers of the committee made a statement to the council last night concerning the results of the deliberations of the committee. His verbal report was in substance as follows:

"The members of the committee, Mayor Hall, Mr. Reynolds and myself are of the opinion that it would be a good policy to accept the offer of the Grande Ronde Reservoir Company to extend to the city the use of its engineer, Mr. Darley, for a few weeks, that he is not at the present time badly needed by that company, and is employed by the company by the year.

"The company's proposition is that the city pay \$175 per month for Mr. Darley's services. This will pay Mr. Darley his regular salary of \$150 per month and give the company \$25 for the use of the instruments. The city must pay for the help required by the engineer.

The expense attached to the work under this plan would be much less than any other that we yet have in sight. Other offers are in the neighborhood of \$10 per day or in the neighborhood of \$1000 flat. The company's offer enables the city to get the job done for less than \$500.

"Engineer Darley thinks that a system of large tanks could be put in to catch the heavy sewerage and that the water from these tanks could be sold to irrigators. It is said that the water so used is free from odor and is readily sought by irrigators in other sections of the country. Another plan would be to cremate the large particles. This would be reported upon by the engineer."

An ordinance authorizing the city council to enter into such a contract was introduced and passed.
