LOCAL BUSINESS TOO HEAVY FOR PRESENT FACILITIES.

Western Union Will Construct Another Wire at Once.

Another Western Union Telegraph wire is to be constructed between Portland and Huntington to do local work. At present there are seven wires between Huntington and Portland, two of which belong to the G. R. & N. The other five can seldom handle

the business adequately and the company has ordered construction of another local wire. Superintendent Dea-ovan has been instructed to prepare switchboards along the line for the new wire when it is put in.

The new line will facilitate matters materially, as local business is slow in transmission at the present time.

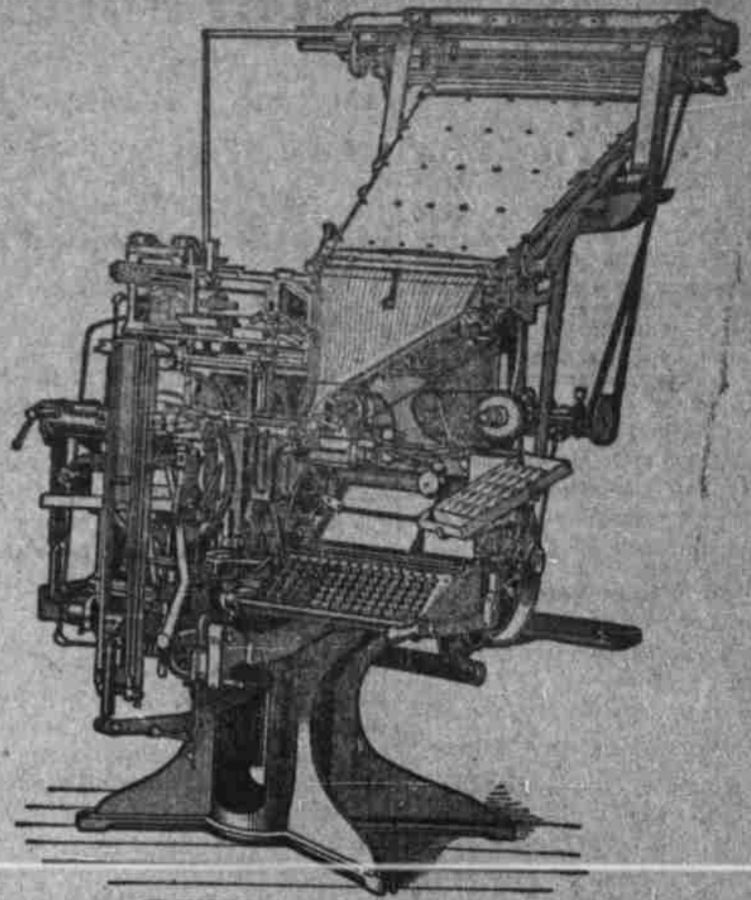
