BETTER CLERK FACILITIES

NEEDED IMPROVEMENTS MADE IN COURT HOUSE.

County Clerk's Office Undergoing Some Changes and Repairs.

The office of the county clerk is undergoing some much needed repairs and changes. The changes embody the addition of one room increasing the size of the office about one third. The carpenters began the work yesterday.

About one half of the vacant space on the east end of the court room is being partitioned off and will be connected with the present main office by a door which is to be cut out. This will give the clerk a private room, one on each side of the public office. The records will remain as at present while the new room will serve as a private consultation room.

Wilson; Secretary of Agriculture, Mrs. Adelaide Grimshaw.
